

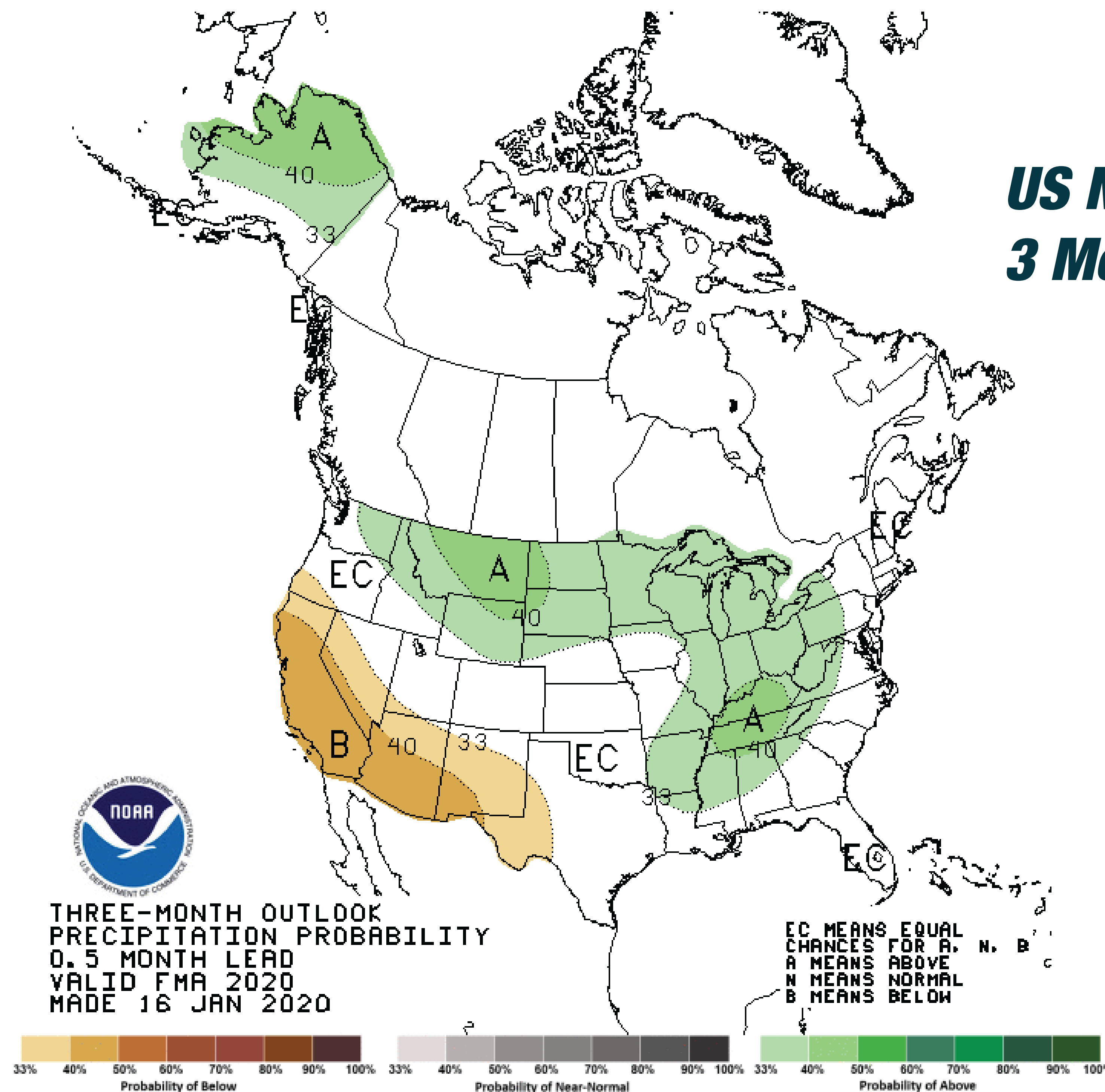
LONG-TERM PRECIPITATION FORECAST

There are four factors to consider when assessing the risk of spring flooding. Those factors are soil conditions, snowpack, reservoir levels, and the *long-term precipitation forecast*.

Flood Risk Factor 4 Long-Term Precipitation Forecast

The National Weather Service and Environment and Climate Change Canada have issued their respective long-term (three month) forecasts for February through April. Each forecast indicates an approximately 30% to 40% chance that the watershed will receive above normal precipitation through April. This forecast indicates moderate risk for precipitation events that could generate runoff.
